Standard of Passing

- I. To pass the Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th Semester Examinations, an examinee shall obtain **not less than 40 %** (Grade 4) marks in each theory course/paper, taking CIE & SEE together. Whereas, for practical/performance-based examination an examinee shall obtain not less than 50 % (Grade 5) marks in each practical, taking CIE & SEE together.
- II. An examinee who is unsuccessful at the examination shall be eligible for admission to the subsequent examinations on payment of a fresh fee prescribed for the examination together with the conditions of the ordinance in force from time to time.
- III. The candidates who pass all the semester examinations in the first attempt are eligible for ranks / university merit positions.

Standard of Passing

- IV. The results of the candidates who have passed the Semester-VIII examination but not passed the lower semester examinations shall be declared as NCL (not completed lower semester examinations). Such candidates shall be eligible for the Degree only after successful completion of all the lower semester examinations.
- V. Provisions of Ordinance No. 3 of 2007 relating to the award of Grace Marks for passing and examination, securing higher division / class and for securing distinction in subject(s) shall be applicable.
- VI. University guidelines and directions issued from time to time regarding Improvement of Results, Reassessment/Revaluation and Incentive Marks shall be applicable to B. Com. Program covered under this direction.

Computation of SGPA & CGPA

- **$SGPA (S_i) = \Sigma(C_i \times G_i) / \Sigma C_i$**

C_i - number of credits of the i th course

G_i - grade point scored by the student in the i th course.

- **$CGPA = \Sigma(C_i \times S_i) / \Sigma C_i$**

S_i is the SGPA of the i th semester

C_i is the total number of credits in that semester

- The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.
- CGPA to Percentage (%) conversion formula:

$$\text{Percentage (\%)} = (CGPA) * 10$$

Illustration for computation of SGPA

$$\text{SGPA (Si)} = \Sigma(\text{Ci} \times \text{Gi}) / \Sigma \text{Ci}$$

Where Ci is the number of credits of the ith course and Gi is the grade point scored by the student in the ith course.

Thus, SGPA = 6.95

$$\text{CGPA} = \Sigma(\text{Ci} \times \text{Si}) / \Sigma \text{Ci}$$

Where Si is the SGPA of the ith semester and Ci is the total number of credits in that semester.

Thus, CGPA = 6.73

Promotion to Higher Semester (A.T.K.T.)

The unsuccessful candidate of any semester examination shall be ALLOWED TO KEEP THE TERM (ATKT) in accordance with the following table: (Theory, Practical and Continuous Internal Evaluation of a course/subject shall be jointly considered as single passing head).

Eligibility for Award of Degree and Nomenclature of the Degree

- A. A student who earns minimum **124 credits** in not less than three years becomes eligible for the award of 'Bachelor of Commerce (Major) with Minor Degree.
- B. A student who earns minimum **164 credits** in not less than four years becomes eligible for the award of '**Bachelor of Commerce (Major) with Minor Honours/Research Degree**.'
- C. The degree certificate shall have the mention of 'Major' and 'Minor' subject opted by the student during the program.

Examples:

- i. Bachelor of Commerce (Accounting & Taxation) with Business Economics as Minor Honors Degree
- ii. Bachelor of Commerce (Business Administration) with Entrepreneurship Development as Minor Research Degree.
